Permit Process/Certificate Of Appropriateness

With summer upon us, homeowners are eager to tackle home improvement projects especially with the energy rebate programs being offered (see back page). Keep in mind that most construction projects require a permit and inspections as part of the process. In addition, because we live in an historic district, a Certificate Of Appropriateness is also required to ensure that all work visible from the street is in accordance with the City of Long Beach Historic Guidelines and individual historic ordinances. Our homes are nearly 100 years old, and windows often become so worn or warped that they are difficult to operate. There are many options available. Several neighbors in our historic district are expert at restoring old windows to 'better than new' condition.
